Championing a **stronger world blood supply**

Ensuring patients have ready access to a safe supply of blood products remains a significant and universal concern.¹ Leveraging our position as a leader in blood collection and processing, a strong focus of our community engagement is combating blood shortages through public awareness campaigns and sponsorship of blood drives across the regions where we operate.

Blood donation events

Our [From the Heart Blood Donation Awareness Program](#) is an instrumental part of this effort. From the Heart empowers our associates to amplify the message that voluntary blood donations are paramount to maintaining a reliable, sustainable, and accessible blood supply. Our associates also use the program’s education and activism tools to let others know everyone can help save lives, whether through donating blood, volunteering, or motivating friends and family.



The program’s objective is to grow the number of donors and donations globally, including inspiring first-time donors and encouraging repeat donations. As the program grows and evolves, we will continue to educate associates, customers, partners, and the public on the powerful, lifesaving value of donating whole blood and its components, including plasma, platelets, red blood cells, and stem cells.

In 2023, this effort resulted in:

430 blood drives worldwide

3,230 associate donors

20,061 total donations

These donations are roughly equivalent to 31,000 cups of coffee. Assuming one blood donation equals 0.47 L (1 pint) and one cup of coffee equals 30 mL (10 oz).

We are proud of our associates and the donors who contributed to the success of this program in 2023. Below we highlight some of the blood donation events held by our regional offices last year.

Blood donation awareness

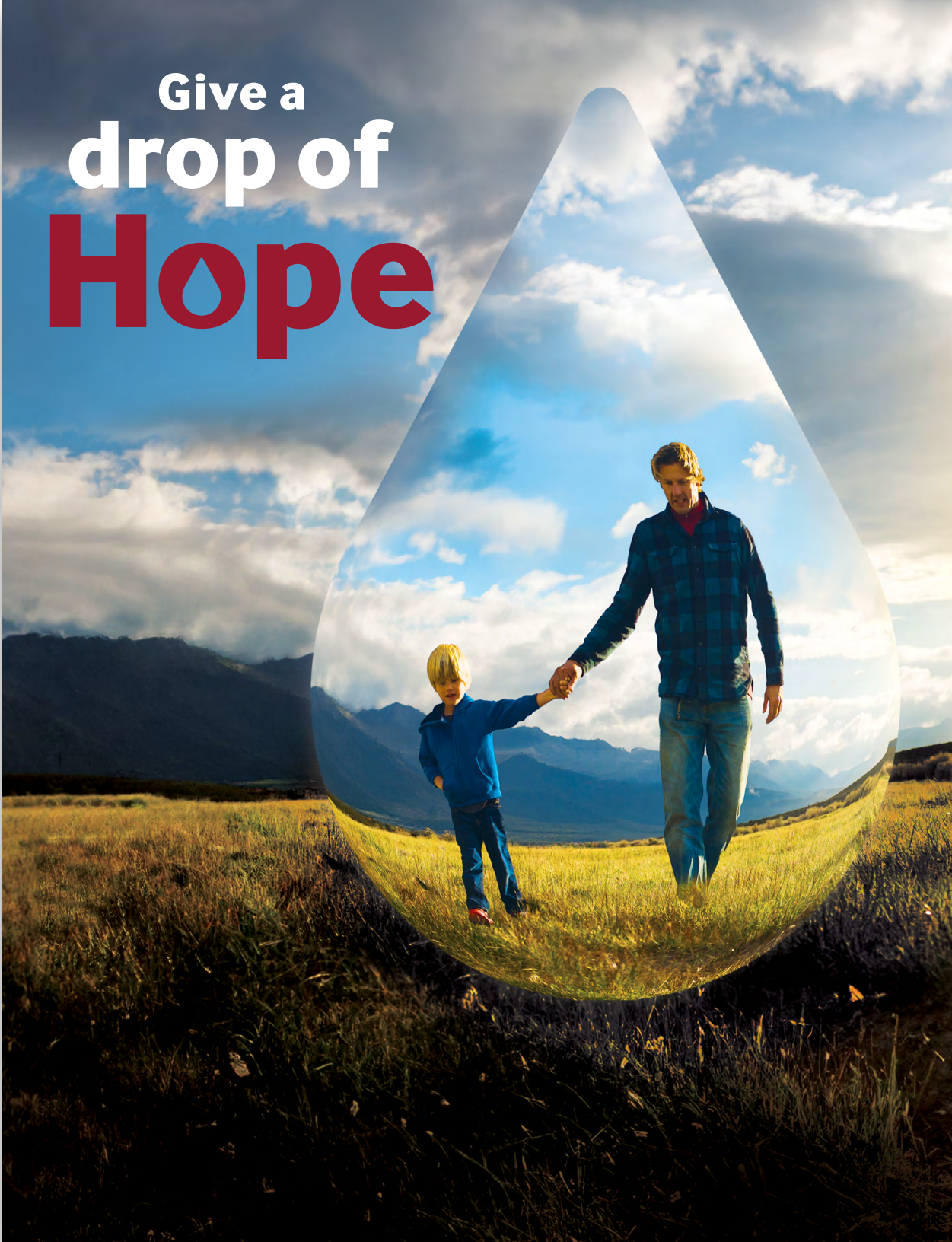
The associates at our facility in India are just one of the teams working hard to raise public awareness of the need for blood donations. In 2023, they partnered on a campaign with the National Service Scheme at the College of Engineering Trivandrum on Erythro 6.0. This two-month campaign included events such as a film screening, a stem cell donor registration drive, a marathon, blood donation events, and a rally.

A Drop of Hope

In July 2024, Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies launched our [Drop of Hope campaign](#). This campaign encourages our local and global communities to explore 60 ways to support voluntary blood and blood component donation (including plasma, red blood cells, and platelets) — from giving blood and volunteering to registering for a stem cell registry, sharing donation experiences, hosting virtual blood drives, spreading the word on social media, and more.



Partnering and supporting mission-driven organizations

Leukemia & Lymphoma Society

In Colorado, we are a corporate donor for the [Leukemia & Lymphoma Society](#) (LLS), the largest nonprofit organization dedicated to creating a world without blood cancers. Our long-term partnership with LLS deepens our connection with the patients our technologies reach.

As part of this partnership, we are long-time supporters of the LLS annual Light The Night fundraising campaign. In 2023, we also hosted numerous other fundraising efforts, including a silent

auction, a golf tournament, a 5 km run, and a sponsored walk, with associates participating and volunteering at each event. We were thrilled to surpass our goal of raising USD \$75,000 — hitting a mark of USD \$110,000. In total, we have raised more than USD \$1.7 million since 2014 to support the LLS mission of ending blood cancer and improving the quality of life for patients and their families.

The Action Center

[The Action Center](#) is a Colorado nonprofit that assists people experiencing hardship — including poverty and homelessness — through resources and services that help them stabilize their lives and find a pathway to lasting change. Like our own headquarters, the organization is based in Jefferson County.

Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies donates time, resources, and funds to The Action Center. For example, each year, our teams in Lakewood, Colorado, hold a food drive and create meal kits to be

delivered during the Thanksgiving holiday season, offering our facility’s parking areas for a drive-through pickup of those meal kits. In 2023, our team packed and distributed more than 1,900 dinner boxes through this initiative.

Associates also participate in the center’s annual initiative to fill backpacks with school supplies for local students.



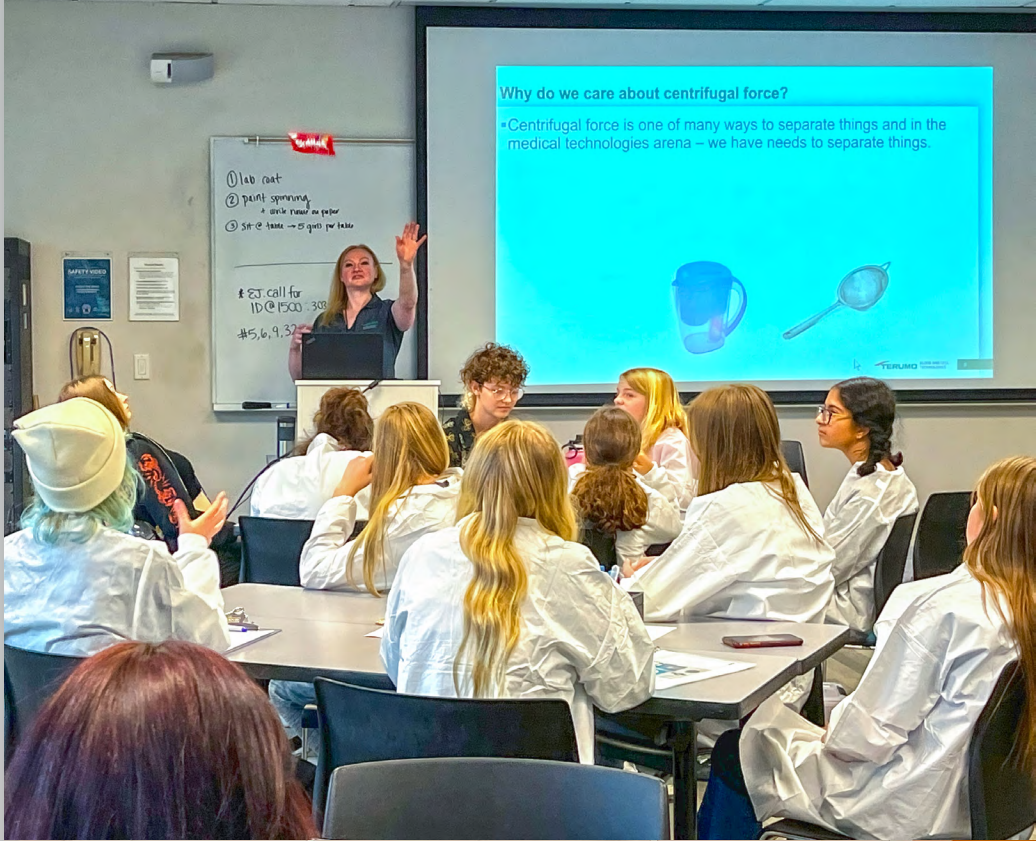

Supporting science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM)

To inspire the next generation, we support STEM programs that help students apply these skills to future career opportunities.

For about 15 years, we have been a proud sponsor and partner with Girls Exploring STEM (GESTEM), an event that offers the opportunity for middle-school girls to learn about different STEM careers through hands-on workshops.

Over the years, we have consistently hosted two rooms at the event, with our associate volunteers working alongside the girls, teaching them STEM concepts in a fun environment. Associates also volunteer as guides, joining a group of girls throughout the day, guiding them to and participating in the workshops, and giving them an opportunity to interact directly with professionals in STEM careers.

We also work with [STEMblazers](#), a local organization inspiring middle- and high-school girls to visualize themselves in the STEM space. Each year, Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies hosts this organization for an afternoon on our Lakewood campus. The day includes a Q&A panel with some of our fantastically diverse women associates in the STEM area. Then we head out on a campus tour of at least three spaces to show the girls in a more hands-on way what the company does.



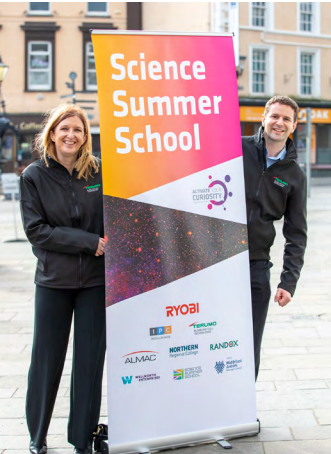

Around the world

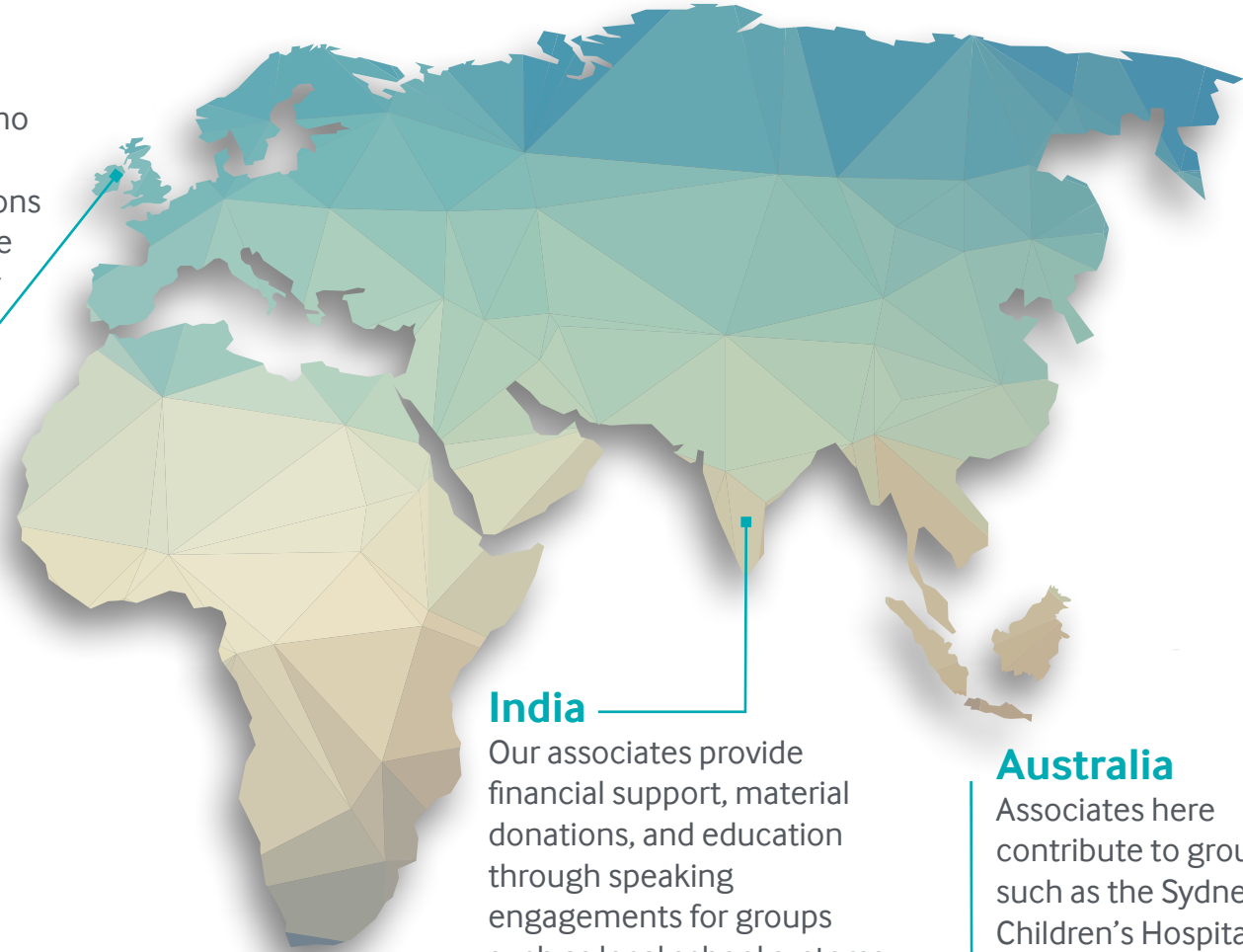
Across the regions where we work, Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies associates partner with many other local organizations that are contributing to society. Below are some examples of our global community engagement and support.

Scholarship distribution to children from four local schools in India



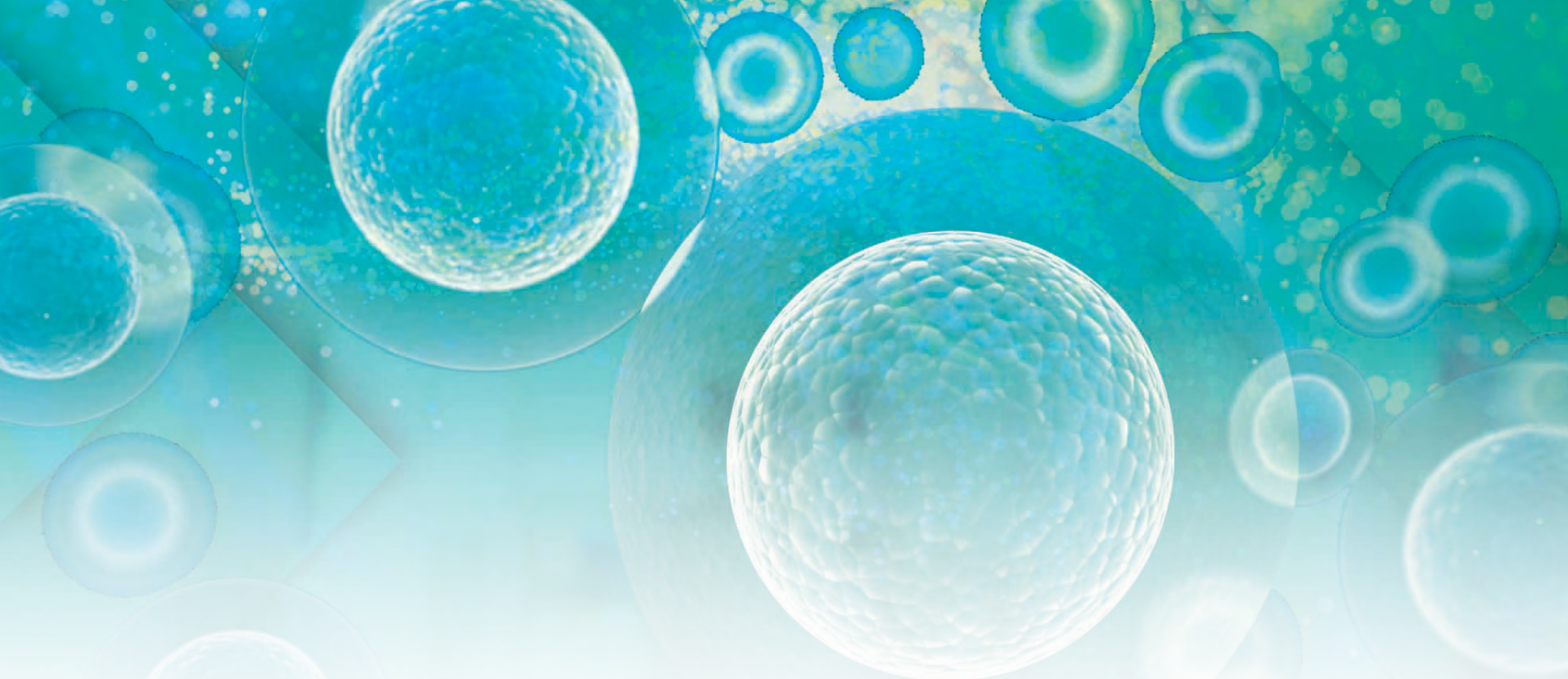
